### Safety Standards:

The ongoing pandemic continues to prompt the use of appropriate hygiene measures during face-to-face events. We want to ensure both comfort and safety for all participants. Hence, the following rigorous safety measures apply.

- All participants must conform to the 2G standard. This means that participants typically have to be fully vaccinated. This is satisfied by two up-to-date vaccinations. Any additional vaccination is highly welcomed, but not mandatory. Please carry some form of proof for this.
- All participants need to be tested for that day. This can be done via official tests around the city (verified by an official certificate), or via our own tests on-site in front of the building. A third vaccination does not substitute the obligation to be tested!
- FFP2-masks or surgical masks are obligatory, especially when moving around, during close discussions, at catering tables or during commutes out of the building. The mask must also be worn at the seat, but the speakers can take their masks off during their talk.

You can, of course, personally decide to take precautions above this standard. We also reserve the right to adjust these measures to the current pandemic situation.
